En Plein Air Norwich, Norfolk, England Art Competition

'Paint Out' is a multi-faceted event aiming to redefine en plein air art practice. Our core event is the premier juried en plein air competition in the United Kingdom, celebrating the talents of national and international artists to a wide and growing audience in the heart of Medieval Norwich.

'Paint Out' Norwich, the UK's premier juried en plein air art competition, returns to the Hostry Festival by popular demand with a prize fund of £5,000. An eminent panel of judges from the Art World will ensure that the highest standards are maintained and that national and international artists will again bring their talents and ingenuity to the streets of Norwich.

This year's expanded event will see up to 50 artists taking part in the core event over the first two days. Artists will be given three hours, morning and afternoon, to complete work that will be exhibited at a Gala Preview and an auction hosted by TW Gaze in The Cathedral Hostry.

A new selection of landmarks around the city have been chosen to provide for diversity of approach and subject matter. A further addition to the proceedings will be a two-night, Nocturne event, where up to ten artists will immortalise the cityscape by night. The Maddermarket Theatre and St John Maddermarket Church, will act as the artists event hub throughout the week, where demonstrations and workshops will further contextualize the skills required for successful results in en plein air work. And Mousehold Heath, with its panoramic and inspiring views of the city, will witness all the artists taking part in a three hour 'Quick Draw' event on the third day, hosted in the auspicious surroundings of the Britannia Café.

Following the success of last year's People's Choice Award category, members of the public are again encouraged to vote for their favourite artist by visiting paintoutnorwich.org during the competition and exhibition. The winner will be announced in The Eastern Daily Press on Friday October 30.







Composer Kenneth Ian Hÿtch first determined to write a dramatic piece for Lisa Cassidy after hearing her at The Hostry Festival in 2013. His search for an enigmatic and interesting character drew him to William Shakespeare's play, Macbeth and he decided to extract and set Lady Macbeth's speeches.

One of William Shakespeare's most complex and vividly painted female creations, Lady Macbeth finds herself in limbo, torturously re-living the events that lead to her death and ruination.

With the other players stripped away, we follow the solitary Lady Macbeth as she suffers the reminiscence of her inevitable undoing.

Pianist William Fergusson and violinist Elizabeth Marjoram form the shadowy thrill of sound that accompanies Lady Macbeth's cruel demise.

Mozart Quintet in B flat Mozart may be the best-known prodigy of all time. It would be possible to select for this concert almost any work he composed in his teens, but perhaps the best fit is his first quintet for 2 violins, 2 violas and cello.
