

Celebrating Plein Air visual arts at The Hostry Festival 2014

The 2014 Hostry Festival will be staging the first ever 'Paint Out' Norwich, a unique outdoor event at which up to 20 selected artists will paint *En Plein Air* at some of Norwich's finest historic landmarks, over two days.

Artists are encouraged to use their choice of art media and to select any vantage point at the six historic Norwich locations. The paintings will be exhibited at The Hostry, Norwich Cathedral, and judged by a panel of experts. They will select one painting from each artist to enter into an auction hosted by TW Gaze of Diss, where ticket holders will have the chance to bid for the first ever Paint Out Norwich paintings. In addition, prizes will be awarded on the Gala Launch Night and Auction on 23rd October. The People's Choice Award will be announced in the Eastern Daily Press on Monday 3rd November.

'Paint Out' Norwich aims to attract national and international talent by introducing an event that focuses on the challenges imposed by painting 'on the spot' in the urban environment. The Festival organisers are keen to see a competition that tests artists' skill and craft to the maximum, promoting the burgeoning Norwich arts scene, and providing an interactive educational experience.






